Dr. Eve Miller is the Director of Research for FranklinCovey Education. In this position, she has led the development of a system for assessing school climate measures, assisted major universities in conducting studies demonstrating the impact of the Leader in Me, and designed an school culture professional development training for school teachers and administrators.

Eve is an experienced cognitive neuroscientist with fifteen years of applied work in various fields, including genetics, healthcare, military intelligence, and education. She has trained in a variety of research methods, from brain imaging to behavioral assessment. Dr. Miller earned her Ph.D. in cognitive neuroscience from the University of Utah, where she did most of her academic research on the environmental factors that play a role in cognitive performance. Her applied work in education stemmed from her doctoral research, which explored how learning environments can be altered to improve learning outcomes for a broader range of learners.

Eve's background in the field of education involves teaching as well. As an adjunct professor at the University of Utah, she has taught six different courses within the Psychology Department; Research Methods, Statistics for Psychology, Cognitive Psychology, Cognitive Neuroscience, Sensation and Perception, and Cognition in the Wild. She loves teaching and considers each assignment a new opportunity to introduce growing minds to the exciting worlds within research and psychology.
