The 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) model aligns with the student, family, and staff offerings of FranklinCovey Education.

- ***Leader in Me Extended Learning Time:*** An evidence-based, comprehensive PK-12 model that builds leadership and life skills in students and lays the foundation for sustained academic achievement.
- ***The 7 Habits of Highly Effective Families:*** Family engagement through leadership events, student-led conferences, and workshops creates a nurturing environment for all family members.
- ***Professional Development for Staff:*** Empowering staff through shared purpose and effective approaches develops a cohesive school culture.

# 21st Century Community Learning Centers Evidence-base Threshold



The 21st Century Community Learning Centers (21st CCLC) program requires applicants to propose a program that demonstrates a statistically significant effect on student outcomes, by meeting ESSA Tier I (strong), II (moderate), or III (promising) evidence in accordance with Section 4205(b)(1)(C).

*Leader in Me* meets the ESSA Tier II, moderate evidence level through two well-designed and well-implemented quasi-experimental studies (Schilling, 2018; White, 2018).

# 4 Key Requirements of 21st CCLC



## **Out-of-School Time Programming**

Offer student enrichment activities during non-school hours, such as before or after school, on weekends, or during school breaks.

## **Targeted Academic Support**

Provide for academic enrichment, including providing tutorial services to help students, particularly students who attend schools in need of additional support, to meet the challenging state academic standards.

## **Non-academic Enrichment**

Provides students with programs, such as youth development, service learning, nutrition and health education, drug and violence prevention, counseling, arts, music, physical fitness and wellness, technology education, financial literacy, environmental literacy, mathematics, science, career and technical education.

## **Active Family Engagement**

Offer families of students served by community learning centers opportunities for active and meaningful engagement in their children's education.
